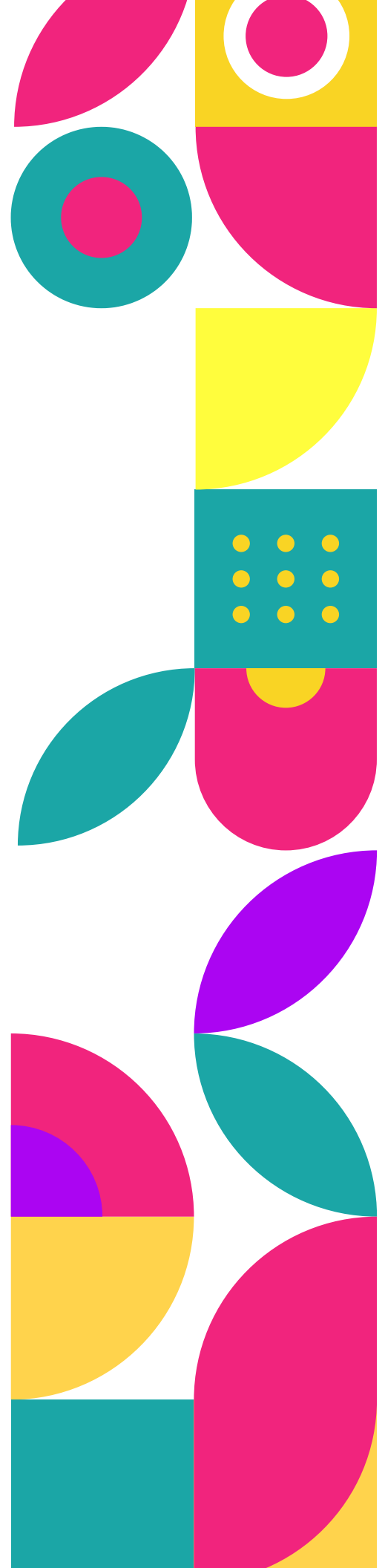

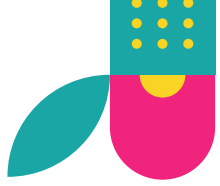




A WORD FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

CODA's first house, leased from the Terre Haute Housing Authority



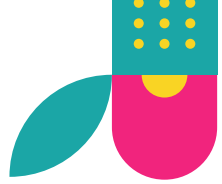
1986

CODA asked the City Council to rezone several properties on S. 14th Street for transitional housing

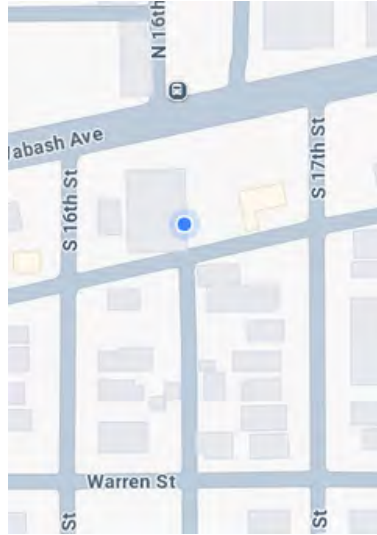
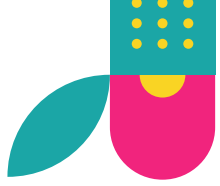
1997

The shelter capacity was doubled with an addition and funded by the redevelopment commission

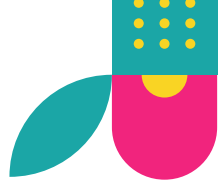
2017

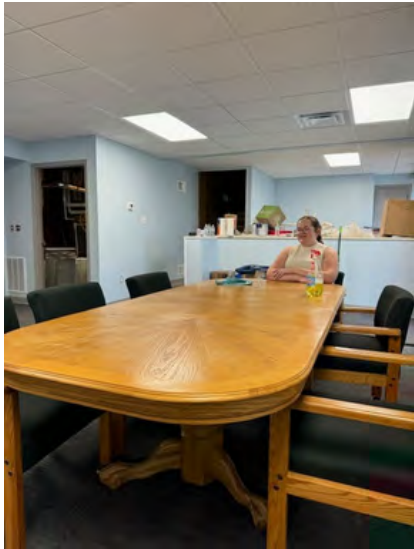

CODA purchased the building across the street from the shelter

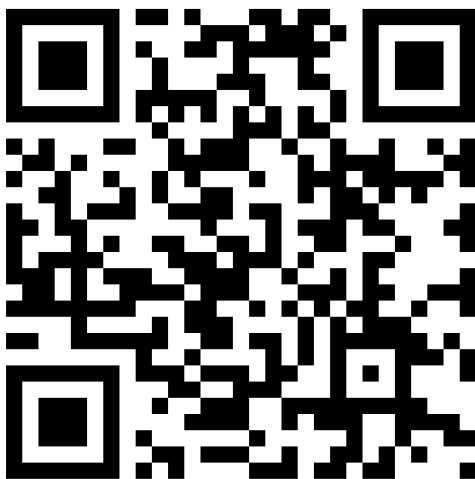
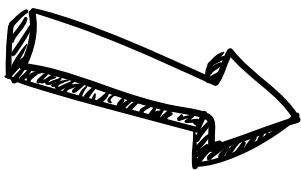

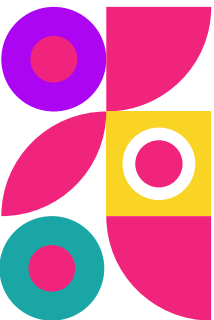
Renovation was completed on the new building and admin staff moved in

Emergency Shelter Services include: bed nights, food, hygiene items, transportation, case management, and more.



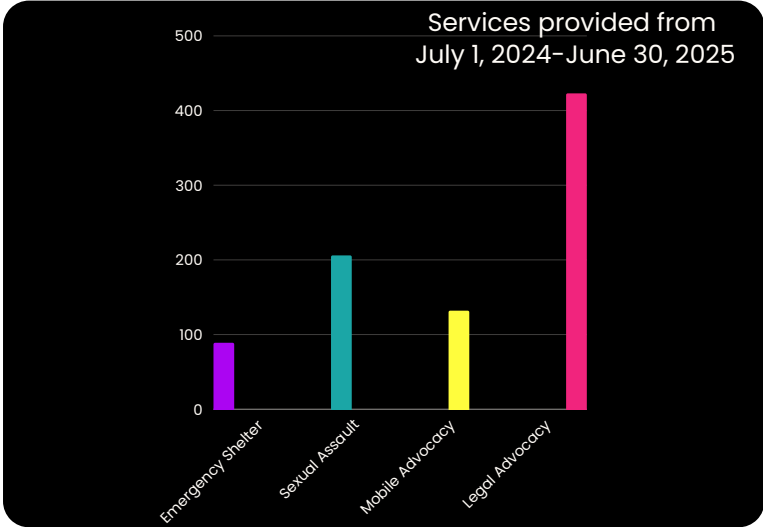
Sexual Assault Services include: hospital response, law enforcement and prosecutor accompaniment, safety kits, resources, and more.



Mobile Advocacy Services include: case management, transportation, resources and advocacy, emergency assistance, and more.

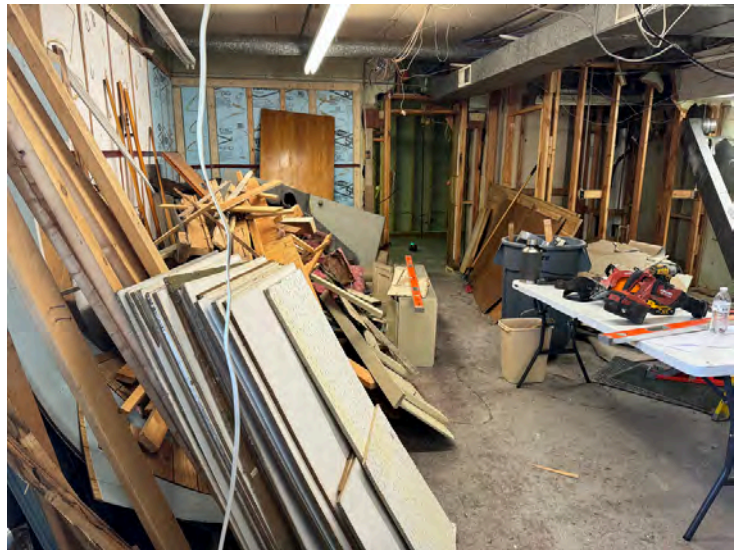


Legal Advocacy Services include: court accompaniment, emotional support, advocacy within the judicial system, and more.

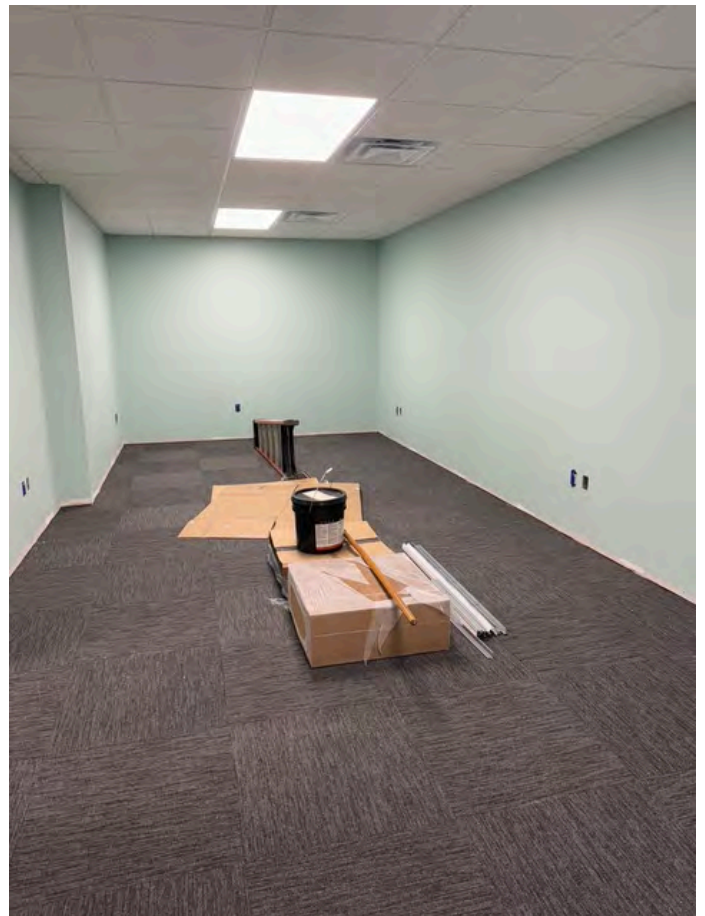

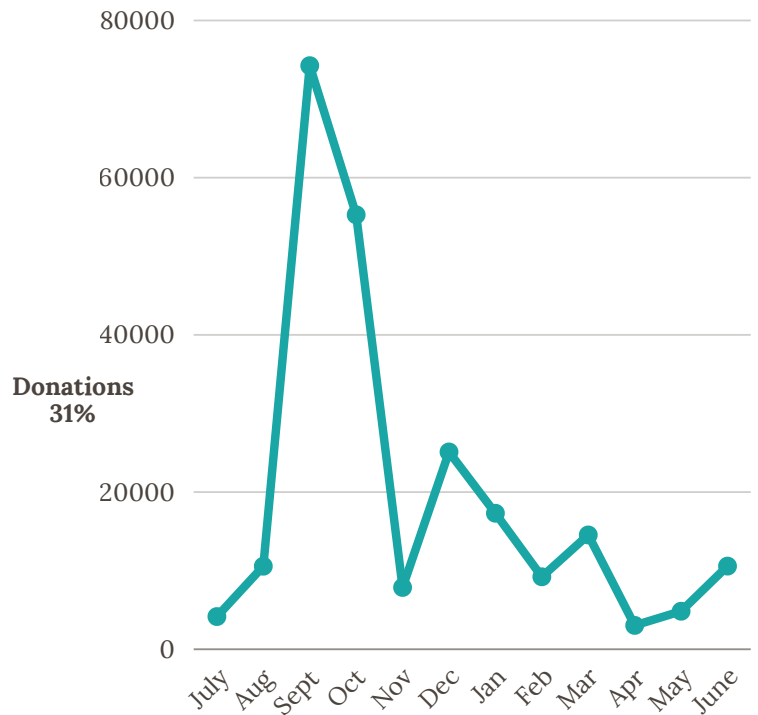
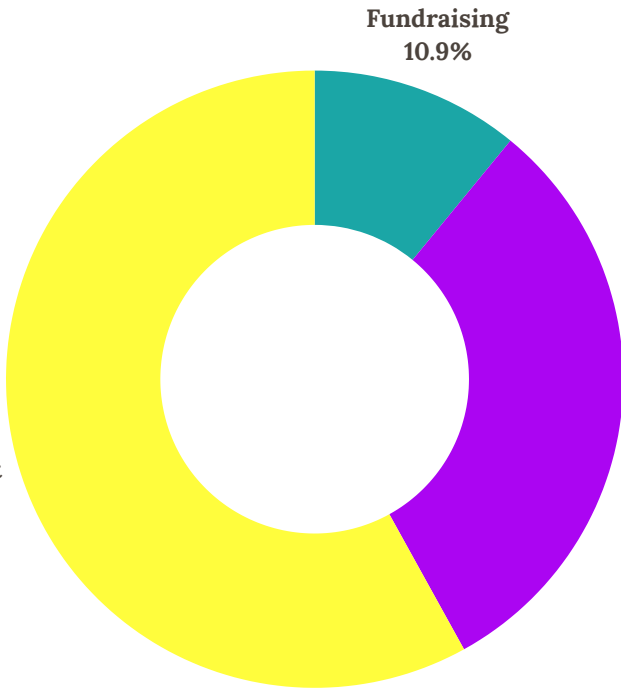

OUTCOME FROM FY25

GOALS

Rape Crisis Center/Sexual Assault Programming

We exceeded our goal, helping 206 Survivors of sexual assault!

In FY26, we want to provide 150 safety kits to Survivors of sexual assault.

Emergency Shelter/Case Management

In FY25, we served 221 clients through shelter and outside case management.

In FY26, we want to increase our mobile advocacy to 300 people served.

Prevention Education

In FY25, CODA continued offering groups about healthy relationships and boundaries to other nonprofit organizations and started teaching groups at the Vigo and Sullivan County Recovery Corners weekly.

In FY26, we want to partner more with our rural counties (Clay, Sullivan, and Vermillion).
